The Asian Association of Social Psychology is pleased to announce a Small Group Meeting, "Understanding Polyculturalism across Societies in the Asia-Pacific: The Future in Culturally Diverse Societies?". The Organizing Committee warmly welcomes early and mid-career scholars, and exceptional PhD candidates, to apply to attend the meeting.

The goal of the meeting is to develop active research on polyculturalism in Asia-Pacific by bringing researchers with shared interests together for dialogue and scholarly exchange. We will launch a new international collaboration project; you will be invited to contribute to the project plan and to carry it forward in collaboration after the meeting.

Publications in a special issue of the *Asian Journal of Social Psychology* or other appropriate journals and a Special Symposium during the later AASP conferences are anticipated outcomes of the meeting.

The Programme

We expect a maximum of 25 participants to attend the meeting. They should be early and mid-career researchers who have a strong interest in researching the topic area of polyculturalism. They must write a brief paragraph about their current research expertise, describe their interest in polyculturalism and why they wish to attend the workshop (2 pages) and include a 2-page CV. Applications that indicate a proposed research project related to polyculturalism are preferred. PhD candidates must attach their primary supervisor's letter of recommendation.
